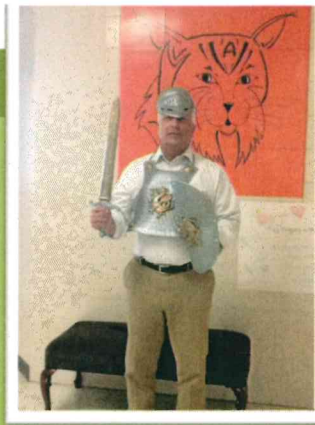

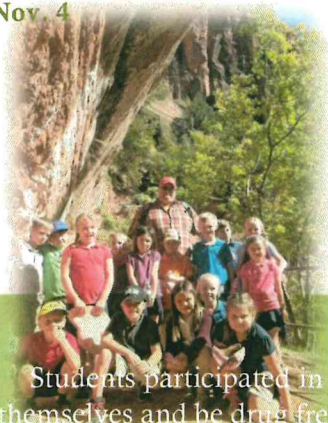
Oct. 31 Happy Halloween!!!!

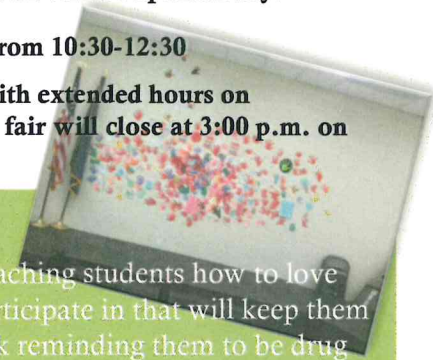
